TOPIC HALF TERM ONE

PERSONAL SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT



This term, the children will focus on making relationships and understanding right from wrong. They will learn why rules are important and how they help to make our school safe and enjoyable for everyone. Through our topics the children will learn that everyone's families and homes are different and that people may have similarities or differences to our own, but we need to respect this and be kind and tolerant towards others. They will also learn about and understand different feelings and techniques to cope with them when they feel overwhelming.

COMMUNICATION LANGUAGE AND LITERACY DEVELOPMENT

Throughout the autumn term, the children will focus on important conversation skills, such as looking at the person who is talking, listening attentively and responding using clear speech. During our big book sessions, the children will learn a wide range of new vocabulary linked to the text or the topic which will help to develop their rich language skills. When making comparisons, the children will understand what an adjective is and how it helps to describe key features which supports understanding of new concepts.



MATHEMATIC DEVELOPMENT



At our school we follow White Rose Maths. This term the children will be learning about matching and sorting objects, making patterns and mastering the numbers 1-5. They will learn about circles, triangles and 4 sided shapes, using them to create pictures and patterns. The children will measure length and weight and use key vocabulary to describe and compare.




Your child will be given a log in and password for Reading Eggs and Numbots. These educational apps are perfect to support your child with their early reading

GOOD NEWS


Calling all parents/carers, grandparents, aunties, uncles and big brothers and sisters - we need your help!!

Reading Books:



Please encourage your child to read every night. Your child will now be coming home with a new practise reading book linked to their phonics phase every Wednesday. These will be collected in each **Tuesday**. Any reading being done at home still needs to be recorded in the reading diary. Diaries are checked daily and each book should be read 5 times a week. It is extremely important that these books are returned **ON TIME** and in **GOOD CONDITION** as they are then used in school. Any books not returned will have a charge of £2.50 on the Arbor app.

Sharing reading books will be changed on a **Tuesday** and a **Friday**.

TRIPS AND EXPERIENCES

DIARY DATES

As part of the 'People Who Help Us' topic we will have several other visitors into school. Firefighters will visit the children bringing their uniform for them to look at and possibly even try on! They will discuss fire safety with the children and there will be an opportunity for them to ask any questions they may have. They will even get a chance to explore a real fire engine!

We will also be visited by a nurse. She will show the children some of her work equipment including her stethoscope and scales and discuss the use of these with them. She will talk about healthy eating and lifestyles with the children and answer their questions.
