# Year 4 Information

## English

In the first half of this term, we will be continuing our learning about the book 'Holes' and writing a nonchronological report. We will then be moving onto reading the book 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane'. We will be writing our own versions of one of the chapters using lots of descriptive writing and grammatical features. In the second half of the term, we will be reading 'The Magic and the Mummy' by Terry Deary . We will be writing an advert for an ancient Egyptian museum.







#### Maths

This term, we will be looking at decimals, geometry, shapes, measurement, time and money.

We will continue to place a large emphasis on learning and recounting our times tables, up to 12x12. It is very important that all children in Year 4 are confident with all times tables.

As part of our learning, we will also be running a times tables club after school on a Monday, where we will be practicing our times tables, playing educational games and using TT Rockstars activities.

Welcome back to Year 4! We hope you had a lovely Easter break. This term we are looking forward to learning lots of exciting things before the summer holidays.

## Geography

Our geography topic this term is 'Exploring Europe'. The children will be recapping the continents before looking closer into Europe. A key skill we will be working on is how to read maps correctly. They will learn about



human and physical geography particularly in relation to Greece. They will also be comparing life in Athens to life in the East Midlands.

#### History

In the second part of the summer term our history topic is Ancient Egypt. The children will be learning all about these fascinating people; who they were, what they believed, how they lived and what they accomplished. Furthermore, we will be looking at replicas of artefacts

from this amazing period of world history. During this topic, we are privileged to have 'Partake', a theatre company, come into school all day to



work with Year 4. They specialise in providing exciting, fully interactive history sessions using artefacts, role-play and investigation. More details will follow soon.

# Religious Education

We will look at 2 topics in RE this term. The first will look at how and why Christians worship. We will link this to spirituality, including similarities with



non-religious people and how music can impact our emotions. The second topic will look at Hindu festivals and how Hindu families practice their faith.



#### Science

This half term our science topic is 'sound'. The children will be looking at what sound is, how sound changes and how sound travels. Next half term, our science topic is 'electricity'. The children will explore electrical appliances and learn all about electrical components.





We will be learning through experiments, research and asking and answering questions.
