What is offered to children with Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

At Crabtree Farm Primary School we ensure children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) receive the support they need throughout their time spent at our school. All teachers are aware of strategies to support children and young people with SEND and where to go for further help if it is needed.

Nottingham City Local Authority have provided advice and guidance around what is considered good practice for schools to put in place as part of everyday (universal) provision to support children and young people with SEND.

Crabtree Farm Primary School follow this advice from the Local Authority and put into place the provision they suggest, as part of our everyday provision available to all children and young people with SEND.

Nottingham City Local Authority have created a set of provision maps to show examples of what should be provided for different areas of SEND including:-

Autism

Cognition and Learning
Sensory and Physical needs including deafness and visually impaired
Specific Learning difficulties (including dyslexia)
Speech Language and Communication Needs
Physical Disability
Social Emotional and mental Health

We support and wherever possible follow these guidelines as much as we can to ensure that all staff provide the best possible support for children with SEND.
